

International Letter of Human Rights - Wearenotacompany

The International letter of human rights consists of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the main instruments that has been encoded: the International Covenant on Civil and political rights and the International Covenant on economic, social and cultural rights. In similar provisions of the Covenants set forth non-discrimination and gender equality as fundamental principles to be applied in conjunction with specific rights. In both Covenants are recognized and defined in more detail the rights contained in the Universal Declaration in the following manner:

International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights

Articles 1-27

Right of self-determination, general principles, right to life, right not to be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment right to not be subjected to slavery, servitude or forced labour, the right to freedom and personal security, the right of persons deprived of their liberty to be treated humanely, right to not be imprisoned by the mere fact of not be able to fulfil a contractual obligation the right to freedom of movement, right of foreigners to appropriate safeguards in the process of expulsion, the right to a fair trial, the right of every person to be do not apply criminal law retroactively, right of everyone to recognition of its legal personality, right to privacy, the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion , right to the freedom of opinion and of expression, right to be free of the propaganda in favour of the war and of all apology of the hate national, racial or religious, right of meeting peaceful, right to associate is freely with others people, right to the protection of the family and to collapse marriage, right of them children to enjoy of protection , right to participate in the life public, right to the equality before the law, to the equal protection of the law and to the not discrimination, rights of them minorities.

International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights Articles 1-15

Right to self-determination, general principles, right to work, right to just and favourable working conditions, the right of everyone to form trade unions and to join your choice and right to strike, the right to social security, including social security, right to family life, right to a standard of living adequate. (Includes the right to adequate food, to adequate housing and the prohibition of forced evictions. (Is has interpreted that this right includes also the right to the water drinking and to the sanitation.), right to the health, right to the education, right of all person to participate in the life cultural, to enjoy of them benefits of the progress scientific and of their applications and to benefit is of the protection of them interests morales and materials that you correspond by reason of them productions scientific literary or artistic that is author.

According to the above information, I am committed to contribute to the improvement of the levels of respect, protection and guarantee of human rights and the application of international humanitarian law.
